IPC published on June 13th 2022, the qualification criteria for Paris 2024 regarding blind football that the IBSA Football Sports Committee had proposed <a href="https://www.paralympic.org/news/ipc-publishes-paris-2024-gualification-regulations-10-sports">www.paralympic.org/news/ipc-publishes-paris-2024-gualification-regulations-10-sports</a>

At the European Championships in Pescara on June 15th 2022, after the semifinals and prior to the final match, IBSA published this report <a href="https://ibsasport.org/blind-football-france-and-turkey-run-for-the-euro-title/">https://ibsasport.org/blind-football-france-and-turkey-run-for-the-euro-title/</a> stating Turkey had qualified for Paris 2024 because they were runners - up in their final game against the host country Paris 2024. Paris of course, already

has a slot because they are the Paralympic Games host.

However, France being the winner of the European Championship 2022 highlighted an ambiguity in IBSA's qualification regulations, relating to interpretation of whether "The host country directly qualifies one team, subject to participation in either the 2023 WC or European 2022" and the phrase "in the following order" accompanied by the specific order of the slot allocations.

- A) **IBSA's intention and interpretation** is that France has already obtained a slot because they are the host country of Paris 2024 and therefore Turkey as the runners up automatically take the slot meant for the winners of this tournament The phrase "in the following order" was only added to address the situation around the World Championships (August 2023) and IPC Parapan Games (October 2023) being out of chronological order (all other regional championships are scheduled in 2022).
- B) However, the IPC has pointed out and also interpreted it in legal terms that the addition of the phrase "in the following order" could be misinterpreted in a way that France receives the slot from the Euros and the vacant host country slot will then go to the world championships (fourth highest ranked team not otherwise qualified). This ambiguity was unintentional.

We are therefore proposing to amend the qualification regulations to remove the ambiguity and reflect IBSA's intended process. If you have any comments on that proposal, we would be grateful if you could let us know by 20th October. We include below the original version and the proposed one for clarity.
